

PROJECT: URGENT TRAVEL WARNINGS!

Specialised Security Services sends out warnings as and when we receive them in an attempt to prevent robberies and accidents on our country's national highways.

Our highways have become a battlefield – not only do we have to be aware of enormous potholes but we must also avoid being pestered by corrupt authorities, violent CIT-heists and dangerous obstacles placed in the road by criminals to commit robberies.

N1 CAROUSEL TOLL PLAZA:

- Many Metro Police stop motorists, especially hunting vehicles with emblems on them, and ask if the person has a firearm.
- They insist on a license, but they then initiate an argument about where the firearm is, whether it is loaded, whether there is a cartridge in the barrel, and whether there is more ammunition in the vehicle that has not been declared.
- Statements have been received that these officers are arrogant and extremely aggressive in their demeanour.
- The Metro Police Officers demand immediate payment or threaten the motorist with immediate arrest and jailtime at the SAPS police station in Hammanskraal.

- The officers extort payments of between R5,000.00 and R10,000.00.
- The officers also target people coming from OT International Airport
 as they immediately demand bribes in dollars.
- They are at this hotspot from approximately 19:00 until daylight the following morning.
 - This ensures that if they arrest the driver, he/she cannot get help before the next morning.
- Please make sure of the following:
 - What type of firearms license you have (sport shooting or selfdefense).
 - This will determine how you may transport your weapon.
 - You may not have a cartridge in the barrel (one up) and it must be in a holster on your body if it is for self-defense.
 - The cartridge of a Sport shooting weapon must be out of the magazine and there must be no ammunition in the magazine.

PIENAARSRIVIER NORTH TO RADIUM, LIMPOPO:

- Spiking incidents are especially prevalent in this area.
- We have received warnings that these are in the northbound lanes.
- According to information, the group consists of approximately 6 suspects.
- They are armed and considered very dangerous.
- They do not hesitate to shoot and a motorist has been killed after an altercation.

HIJACKING HOTSPOTS:

- As with spiking on highways, the hijacking hotspots also change; therefore, it is important to keep informed on these.
- The prime times, however, are usually standard:
 - On Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays between 18:00 21:00.
 - On Friday and Saturday evenings from 21:00 to midnight.
 - During peak-morning traffic times, 06:00 09:00.

IMPORTANT SAFETY MEASURES:

- Monitor the news and be aware of hotspots.
- Avoid driving alone.
- Avoid driving at night.
- If possible, put your live location on and have a responsible person monitor it until you are safe.
- Be vigilant and check that you are not being followed.
- Always be vigilant and keep an eye out for any persons on bridges or embankments.
- Keep your eyes on the road and look for any objects on the road that could pose a danger. If you see anything suspicious, reduce your speed and change lanes safely.
- Do not stop to remove anything from the road surface.
- Ensure that your vehicle is roadworthy and that you do not place yourself in a vulnerable situation when it does break down.
- Ensure that all of its lights and indicators are in working order and that you stay within the speed limit to ensure that there is no reason for traffic officers to stop you for such a minor infringement.
- If your vehicle does breakdown, rather stay in the car. Assess your situation and call emergency services.
- If you do hit road spikes and your tires are blown out, do not stop rather drive on to a place of safety.
 - Instead, reduce your speed, turn on your hazards, and slowly reach a safe area. If this means having to drive on your wheel rim, do so slowly.
- If a criminal or corrupt officer confronts you, try to stay as calm as possible:
 - Do not argue.
 - Do not make any sudden gestures.
 - Avoid eye contact.
 - Make an effort to show cooperation.


